

OUTCOME:



learnt. Discussion on online teaching and its impact among the students were discussed in the





children from sexual assault and abuses. Discussion was made on policy laid for children's protection.





- To impart knowledge on different acts on child labour among the participants.
- To enrich the importance of family well-being among the participants.
- To discuss on the gender sensitization and current problems faced by women of all age groups.

DAY 2

OBJECTIVES:

- To understand the problems and the challenges faced by the migrant workers due to displacement.
- To discuss on the Swatch Bharat scheme and the statistics related to migrants workers.
- To explore the mental health concerns of women sanitation workers and cancer patients in India.
- To emphasize and create awareness on lack of physical and mental health in India.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW:

Morning Session (Day 1 - 24/07/2020)

The 1st session of the National Virtual Conference on CO-CREATING A POSITIVE & SUSTAINABLE URBAN ENVIRONMENT commenced with a Prayer by Peter, a student of Social Work. Ms. Usha Jose, Associate Professor of the Department of Social Work, delivered the welcome address which was followed by the Inaugural Speech given by Dr. Fatima Vasanth, the Academic Director of Patrician College of Arts and Science The CEO and Founder of the World Vision India, Mr. Madhav Bellamkonda, delivered the keynote address of the virtual conference.

The Panel discussion for the first session was on the topic "Urban and Child Labour" moderated by Dr. Helen Sekar, a Senior Fellow at V.V Giri National Labour Institute. The first paper presented was "A Study on Socio-economic and Educational Problems faced by Children at Chemmencheri Slum Clearance Board" by Francis Dhivakar, Assistant Professor at Don Bosco College. His paper revealed the social, economic, academic and other effects of eviction of

people from slums into slum clearance board, especially on children. The presentation also elaborated on the general stereotypes, prejudice that prevailed among the general public on the people of slum clearance board and the unhygienic living conditions of the people there. Mr. Dhivakar also suggested necessary steps that can be taken to find solution for the problems stated from his findings.

The second paper was by Brother John Clinton, an MPhil research scholar, titled "Awareness among college students on child sexual abuse and its prevention strategies". The presenter discussed the definitions of child, child abuse and sexual abuse in detail. He delivered his findings from the interviews which were the basis for the research and concluded that there was a rapid increase in the child sexual abuse cases.

"Urban Child Labour: A global tyranny and inhuman issues, A KATHAKAR'S METHODOLOGY" was the third and final paper of the 1st session of the conference presented by Jyoti Sharma, II MSWC – Indira Gandhi National Open University, Delhi. Her paper described the common causes for child labour, major areas of exploitation and hazardous child labour and the consequences and negative impact of child labour. She also explored the role of gender stereotypes and gender bias in child labour.

The moderator of the panel discussion, Dr. Helen Segar, emphasized that the work of girl children wasn't recognized and were doubly vulnerable when it came to child labour. There was a short question answer session in which the questions from the participants were answered by the moderator. She concluded the moderation by expressing her thoughts and views on the papers that were presented. The session ended with the felicitation of the moderator Dr. Helen Segar by Dr. Anjana who was Senior Director of special projects at World Vision India.

Evening Session (Day 1 - 24/07/2020)

The session started with an introduction of the moderator, Dr. Poongodi Bala MBBS, MRC Psych (UK), Consultant Adult, Child Adolescent Psychiatrist, Behavioural Counsellor and Former Consultant in Manchester (UK). Dr. Bala spoke a few introductory lines about the topic of the session, "Family Well-being" and also emphasized the need for family well-being during the COVID –19 pandemic.

The first presentation of the session was on the topic "Family Relationships and Intimate Partner Violence" by Angeline Nivedha, a student of the social work department. Her presentation explored the concept of Intimate partner violence and the importance of family.

The causes and effects of such violence on the victims, especially women in India, were discussed in detail followed by suggestions for awareness programs, stricter laws and better family environment.

The next presentation was by Preethi Mariam Oommen and Aishwarya Gopinath, students of social work from Madras Christian College, on "Gender equality and violence against middle-aged women in slums of Chennai". Their presentation focused on the gender inequality in the society by considering the socio-economic and educational status of middle-aged women in the slums of Chennai. Husbands were the major perpetrators of violence in the lives of these women and they were more mentally, verbally and economically abused. There was barely awareness among the women about domestic violence. The presenters also made a documentary to emphasize their claims and concluded their presentation by explaining the roles of a social worker to empower these women and sensitizing people about domestic violence.

The moderator was called to express her expertise and thoughts about the presentations. She made the participants understand the causes and effects of domestic violence, the gender stereotypes and gender inequalities prevailing in the society. She congratulated the presenters for their efforts and good work. Questions were posed to the moderator and the presenters from the participants and the session concluded with the felicitation of Dr. Poongodi Bala by Ms.Clara Raphael the Head of My City Initiative at World Vision India.

Morning Session (Day 2 - 25/07/2020)

The session started with an introduction of the moderator, Dr.Debolina Kundu, Associate Professor at the National Institute of Urban Affairs, New Delhi. Dr. Kundu expressed her views about the migrants and livelihood. Then, she requested the presenters to start their presentation so that she can give suggestions after a small overview of the topic.

The first presentation of the session was on the topic "Urban policy and its impact on the urban poor" by Ms.Anne Carolin, a student of social work department, Loyola college Chennai. She presented the concept of migrant workers displacement and also explained about the involvement in displacement. The consequences of the displacement and the measures taken by the government were discussed in detail. She concluded that the government was not given any compensation and protection to people who were displaced.

The second presentation was presented by Ms. Sharavanthi Rekha, M.Phil Scholar, Loyola College Chennai on the topic "Capacity building for the students residing on women's welfare

hostel in Chennai through theater for transformation". The presentation focused on the improvement of communication and self-esteem for the welfare hostel students through theater methods. She explained that Family conditions, poor performance in school and financial conditions are the major contributing factor for the welfare hostel students. She concluded that lack of confidence and self-esteem were the major limiting factor for the welfare hostel students.

The third presentation was by Giffin Jose, SOS CV, Gujarat on "challenges faced by migrant labourers and their alternative livelihood options". He presented a overview on migrant workers and challenges faced by them during this pandemic situation. He also explained that the millions of migrant workers migrate from villages to various cities in search of their livelihood. He also suggested that value added products, making cooperatives at villages and strengthing of self help groups to village organization will be their alternative livelihood options. He concluded that government as well as non government organizations can support the migrant workers in terms of livelihood.

At last, the moderator was requested to express her expertise and thoughts about the presentations. She made the participants understand how the research paper to be presented by giving constructive comments for each presenter. She gave statistical values of urbanization in India for many years and suggested the presenters to use correct methodology abstract. Then she explained that income data was not given whereas the expenditure data is had been increasing for many years. Finally, she congratulated the presenters for their excellent research work. Leanne maria, Assistant professor, Department of social work, Patrician college of arts and science taken over the question and answer session were the questions raised by the participants was discussed with Dr.Debolina Kundu as well as the presenters. The session concluded with felicitation of Dr. Debolina Kundu by Dr. Anjana Senior Director, Special Projects, and World Vision India. and values.

Evening Session (Day 2 25/07/2020):

The evening session of the national conference started with the introduction of the panel moderators Dr. Anitha vector and Dr.Kalyani Gopal. Dr. Anitha vector addressed the participant through power point presentation indicating evolution and urbanization, and lack of

mental health around India. There were three presenters for the evening session to present their

papers on mental and physical health.

The first paper was presented by Jijo Joy, Head of the department, school of social work, De

paul institute of science and technology, Kerala on urbanization and mental health. His paper

mainly focused on managing depression through psychological, medical and complementary

and life style interventions. He concluded his presentation to urging the people to break the

chain during this pandemic "by staying home, staying safe and staying healthy".

The second paper was presented by Mukshitha Dhrangadharia, research scholar, Department

of social work, Sadar Patel University, Gujarat on examining the impact of demographic factors

on mental health of cancer patients. She elaborated on the mental health of the cancer patient

and lack of counselling services due to their economic crisis. She presented the outcomes of

the study to get clear concept of her research paper.

The third paper was presented by Tanya Stephanic Monteiro, research scholar, Department of

social work, Pondicherry University on "MENTAL HEALTH AT THE INTERSECTIONS OF

MARGINALIZATION exploring the mental health concerns of women sanitation workers in

India". The presenter gave brief introduction on mental health marginalization followed by

methods used in the research paper. The paper mainly focused on intersectionality and social

system theory. The presenter also emphasized the risk in sanitation work and problems faced

by women sanitation work. The presenter gave clear picturisation of conceptualizing the

relation between marginalization and mental health. The presenter concluded her presentation

with implication on marginalization and mental health.

At the end of the presentation the panel moderators shared their views on the paper presented

by the presentees followed by valedictory session. Ms. Divya. J, Assistant Professor,

Department of social work, Patrician College of arts and science addressed National virtual

conference report 2020 followed by the valedictory chief guest address. The valedictory chief

guest addressed the gathering and thanked the department of social work, patrician college of

arts and science for organising National virtual conference in collaboration with World Vision

India. Nation virtual conference came to an end with vote of thanks by Dr. Sindhu Sivan, Head

of the department of social work, patrician college of arts and science.



Then followed by question and answer session students from various institutions raised questions to the resource persons were they cleared their doubts.




